

APRIL & MAY'S UPDATE ON THE GUYANA'S MISSION WORK

Fellow Servant of Jesus Christ & Faithful Partner of the Gospel of Jesus Christ,

Greetings to you, your family and all the saints there where you worship. Grace and peace be unto you. Trust that this update uplifts your spirit as we work together to bring honour and praise to our God and to glorify him as a result.

It is indeed a great opportunity to allow the Gospel of Jesus Christ to knit us together for a common cause. With your investment both prayerfully and financially, undoubtedly “the work” of Guyana’s Mission for Christ Ministry of which you are a part of has greatly improved both numerically and spiritually amidst and not forgetting the challenges to get the work done. That’s why Prayer remains a very important part of our ministry. Praying for all those who are supporting us financially and prayerfully, but your financial support (no matter how small) means alot to the existing work to continue and progress for the glory of God.

Your monthly or your quarterly financial gifts helps to foster the mission work in terms of physical and spiritual growth and brothers it’s indeed a pleasure to be a part of this growing ministry. There are much more to be done but with time and patience we will continue to accomplish our goals set.

Our “*main areas of concern*” for the very first two quarters of this year 2025 were the construction and completion of the new Laluni Church building. For this year 2025 our construction work on the new Laluni Church building was hindered by close to three weeks (in April & the start of May) we have experienced lots of rains and thunderstorms in the night. This hasn’t worked well with our cement mixture, so all our work was put on hold.

Yesterday, Thursday 8th May, our workers (two Masons along with our missions’ driver) returned to new Laluni Church building and continue the work that was left hanging. Continuing the work on the male and female toilets, bathroom areas for both male and female and the water trestle that will accommodate four (4) – 450 gallons on water, either from the roof (through rain fall) or water pumped from the ground using a water pump. So, all these are just ready just that these masons must do their job and them together.

After this, the roof will be worked on and this is a huge part of the building and the construction requires for the formation (wooden roof) the painting of the wooden materials to avoid wooden eating insects and guttering, then the laying of the metal sheets.

Please note that this building has been constructed in phases, all is because we couldn’t arrive at a cost figure. The prices for construction and building materials here in Guyana attracts a 14% Value Added Tax (VAT) and prices are increasing almost every week by a \$1 or \$2 US. Our prices are not stable.

So far, the tariffs put on Guyana by the US State is not really affecting us as we expected. So, we thank God for that. The lord’s willing, we should be able to complete our building by the end of June 30th, 2025, and I want to plea with everyone – **“IN WHATEVER SMALL WAY – PLEASE CONTRIBUTE FINANCIALLY.”**

Another area where we spent lots our \$\$\$\$ went the new Blue Berry Hill Campus Site of the Georgetown School of Preaching and Biblical Studies, Region # 2, Essequibo Coast. It's mostly a riverain area with the transportation using ferry boats carrying both vehicles and passengers. A Region that has a scattered population of 62,467 persons (2021 census) and only seven congregations of the Lord's church. No school of Preaching as to prepare faithful men and women to propagate the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Blue Berry Hill Church of Christ, Essequibo Coast has allowed us freely to accommodate the top flat of the building but upon inspection the roof of the building needs a little repair and repainting also the bats infested the roof. That must be looked at immediately and the electrical wiring is old and must be replaced to secured that there is no fire.

On the good side, we have already supplied all the furniture needs, bought and prepared at Sophia and then transported with our flat bed truck using the ferry service. Travelled more than three times to get the campus fixed.

At present we have an enrolment of eight students (8) and a campus director / class instructor has been appointment. This evening, I worked with the Electrician concerning the estimate for the electrical installation.

The Kuru Kururu campus is up and running. Students were on holidays and return to school April 28 but unfortunately, they had to return home, and Teachers had to work with each student. In Guyana there was a situation where an eleven-year-old girl was found dead in one of our international hotel's swimming pools and this has caused a civilian protest and uprising where stores were broken into and lives were lost. To this date, Saturday, May 10th it seems as though everything has returned to normalcy, but the 11-year-old child is still not buried. The Police are doing more investigation. This week, Monday, May 12 – the students at the Kuru Kururu campus site will begin to meet as usual on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Marriage done: On Saturday, April 26, 2025 - Andrew Leon Haynes & Nathalie Emerita Welcome tied their matrimonial knot at the Sophia Church of Christ. This couple live home together without being marry for 25 years. Their daughter Marissa Smartt – who is a graduate of the Georgetown School of Preaching and Biblical Studies (Class of 2020 – 2022) and teaches at the children's ministry really worked with her parents to get them out of their sinful relationship. Br. Mervyn Gobin and Clifford Hicken and I also did much encouraging! Let's pray for this young marriage couple!



Upcoming Events:
