## “Digging Deeper”



“Digging Deeper” can have multiple meanings. The picture above gives one a sense of just one of those meanings. That is, physically digging a deep hole and making it deeper. The hole above represents the first steps for a new multipurpose building on the campus of the Mekanisa School for the Deaf (which is the building just behind the deepening hole). More will be said about the plans for this new building in future releases and via other communication channels.

For the AABTI and its’ students, we are in the final months of a 2-year journey of Biblical exploration. For each of our 20 students, this has involved a deeper dive into the Text of Scripture than they have had in the past. I am so excited that a group of national brothers from Addis are going to be able to travel down-country again during the next 2 week break from the AABTI program. I look forward to the day when we "farenjis" (foreigners in Ethiopia) will be able to travel and minister more freely outside of Addis Ababa.

Many thanks to the 11 different men that have taught and will teach this group of students. This diversity of backgrounds in our teachers is a special blessing to this group of men. Each brings special strengths and insights to the men. It helps them dig not just "deeper" but also "wider" into the encouraging depths of God's word.
